Dear Chairman Graves and Ranking Member Larsen:

On behalf of the member companies of the General Aviation Manufacturers Association (GAMA), I am writing in strong and ardent support for the proposal being considered this week by the U.S. House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee to make critical air traffic workforce, technology, and infrastructure investments. The committee-proposed section 100008 provides \$15 billion as a critical and essential downpayment to ensure that America has a safe, resilient, and modern National Airspace System (NAS) now and in the future. This initiative builds on the strong foundation of the Committee's work and leadership on the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2024 (Public Law 118-63).

Recent tragedies have highlighted to the American people the importance of a strong air traffic control system and government and industry must come together to deliver on that expectation. We are also heartened by the interest in the U.S. Senate as well as the ongoing commitment by the appropriations committees in both bodies to support the FAA's ability to manage and invest in a safe air traffic control system.

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Thank you again for your leadership and willingness to take decisive action to provide a critically needed downpayment for the safety and efficiency of the air traffic control system. This Committee is once again demonstrating its visionary and proactive approach to address significant aviation policy and issues, which is very appreciated and valued throughout the industry.
